EUROPEAN REFUGEE CRISIS

At the moment the Irish Methodist World Development & Relief will not be launching a special appeal for this current crisis. It is often difficult to know when an appeal should be officially launched within MCI through WDR. Unfortunately there are atrocities and natural disasters around the world that are continually on a scale that warrant an appeal. The media do not necessarily report them all. WDR does not have partners in Europe. However, WDR's sister agency, Christian Aid Ireland, is a member of the ACT Alliance (All Churches Together) and can channel money to ACT partners in Europe that are responding to the need.

- Send a cheque directly to your local Christian Aid Office (made out to 'Christian Aid Ireland') specifying that the funds are for the refugee crisis in Europe and the response by ACT partners.
- Send a cheque payable to 'Methodist World Development & Relief Fund' to this office and mark it as being for 'refugees in Europe'. This will then be paid by WDR to Christian Aid Ireland to follow the same route as above.

The WDR Committee asks Methodist people to consider why refugees exist at all and, as well as responding to the symptoms of poverty and injustice, that we as individuals and a church commit to supporting long-term development that potentially reduces the need for those living in poverty and under injustice to leave their homes. WDR is committed to this on your behalf and through its core and co-funded partners is helping to bring stability and transformation to communities throughout the developing world. Call to Prayer from the President, Methodist Church in Ireland

The President of the Methodist Church in Ireland, Rev Brian Anderson along with Bishop Patricia Storey, Church of Ireland has set off on a Peace Pilgrimage to Israel and Palestine.

The President said he was excited about the trip but anxious about leaving the country at this time:

"It is really a trip to understand how some groups are trying to bring reconciliation to two ideologies, as they clash, with at times deadly results. Part of me is reluctant to go because I am fearful of what may happen to the Executive at Stormont. Yet again we stand at the edge of the precipice of a black hole, this time because of a lack of trust. I see the similarities in the two countries' stories. One can't trust the other, so progress is stalled. The poet Ben Okri describes our past as sometimes a 'bully' who comes along and with unreasonable force, bullies his way into our present, spoiling it. Whether they have gone away or not, it is certain the past has not and until we find a way of bringing it out into a safe space that some structure can permit we will stay close to this deadly precipice. I wish to call all Methodists to prayer. Please urgently uphold our leaders, political, commercial, church or community, that God would direct our pathway in the way of peace-making, and that a settled government will lead us."
